Blackness is the very essence of our humanity. It stands in strong contrast to expediency and capitalistic greed. It stands in strong contrast to the ongoing, ever-present injustice and hypocritical policies of the United States of America, including *all* of the Democratic and Republican Party [i.e. Republicrat] U.S. Presidential candidates.
